I like a jigsaw puzzle. Dining table extended, patio doors open, cold drink to hand (maybe a biscuit or two), a new jigsaw, and I'm quite content. I've been known to lose myself in a jigsaw for days on end...

I am fussy about my choice of jigsaw though. It must be at least 1,000 pieces, and the picture must be interesting. I favour animals over landscapes, but there are all sorts of puzzles available including 3D puzzles, WASGIJ puzzles (where the puzzle <u>in</u> the box is not the same as the puzzle <u>on</u> the box, and Impuzzibles (think images of nothing but baked beans or water!). My record is 1,500 pieces, but apparently the largest jigsaw I can buy has 60,000 pieces and is 29 feet long. I fancy a crack at that, but I'm not sure I have room at home. I might have to cancel Sunday services at Longfleet for a few weeks and take over the floor...!

With a jigsaw, every piece is important. Without every piece being fitted correctly and in its rightful place, you don't get a complete picture. What is on the table is not the same as what is on the box. And it only takes one piece to be out of position and it throws the whole picture out of kilter. Every piece needs to be positioned as the designer intended to get the full picture.
