The image I used on Good Friday was of a man carrying a cross up a hill (see below) and this is the scripture I offered: "You see, at just the right time, when we were still powerless, Christ died for the ungodly. Very rarely will anyone die for a righteous person, though for a good person someone might possibly dare to die. But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us." (Romans 5:6-8 NIV)



I also included the time of our Good Friday service of course, just in case anyone was looking for a church family to worship with.

If you mention God on social media, most folks will either put an Amen, or pass on by – with perhaps the odd angry face emoji, but nothing

more hostile than that... usually.

If you put an image of the cross of Christ on social media in 2024, it truly revolts and offends a minority. It garnered relentless mocking of Jesus (and his followers), comments about inciting hatred against those who are non-Christians and furious abusive comments about how God causes wars and cancer and so on and that the church has no place to bring conversations about Jesus outside of our own "religious" pages.

We know that our fight is not with people, because that's what God's word tells us. The spiritual reality is that the fight we are in is with the so-called "master" many are unwittingly serving and enslaved to. So the devil tries to silence the truth. There's nothing new under the sun!

Please pray for all Christians that post on social media, that we would be protected from responding in anger when provoked (because that temptation is right there), that we would have wisdom from God in how and when we respond and vitally, that we would always remember whom we serve.

Something to pray about and to commit to – we are in the good fight. So let us all talk about Jesus Christ openly and be unashamed to do so. The enemy is terrified every time we point to the Cross of Christ and tell people of the certainty of the great love God has for people.
